How to get in Rovaniemi from Helsinki

By Air:

Most of the flights go south to Helsinki and not direct to Rovaniemi. Flights from Helsinki to Rovaniemi operated by **Finnair**, **Blue1** or **Norwegian** and maybe cheaper than corresponding train. Rovaniemi Airport (RVN or EFRO) is located about 11 Km / 8 Miles north from the City Center.

By Train:

If you would like to travel by train, you can check Timetables and buy your train tickets directly on **VR**, http://www.vr.fi/en/index.html. The journey takes approximately 9-12 hours and you can choose a night train without loosing a minute of the day!

The railway station is located right next to the city centre and is within an easy walking distance.

Tip: The easyest and fast way to get to Rovaniemi center is to take the "Airport Taxi Express" is the best, the most confortable and cheaper than the Taxi.

By Coach:

You may contact **Gold Line** or **Matkahuolto**. Both operate in a daily base night buses to Rovaniemi from Helsinki via <u>Helsinki-Vantaa Airport</u>. Coming by bus from the south is relatively cheap but requires about 14 hours of sitting! The bus station is in the city center is just a few hundred meters away from the railway station.

Rovaniemi

Location: 66° 30′ North, 025°44′ East

Population: 60,707

Area: 8,016.72 km² (3,095.27 sq mi)

Land: 7,581.97 km² (2,927.41 sq mi) **Water:** 434.75 km² (167.86 sq mi)



History: Located at the confluence of two large rivers, the most important transport routes at the time, Rovaniemi began to adopt the role of the "gateway to Lapland". There has probably been continuous settlement in the Rovaniemi area since the Stone Age. Periodic clearances of new land for agriculture and the practice of slash-and-burn cultivation began around 750-530 B.C. Meanwhile, artefacts found in the area suggest that an increasing number of travellers from Karelia in the east, Häme in the south and the Arctic Ocean coast in the north, must have come there 500 A.D. onwards. One cannot talk about the people of Rovaniemi until the time when the area was first given its name. The oldest surviving instance of the name in writing dates from 7th September 1453 when the bailiff of Ostrobothnia confirmed a transfer of land between the farms of Korkalo and Rovaniemi, although the name must have been in existence much earlier. The word Rovaniemi has often been considered to be of Lappish origin, as "roavve" in Saami denotes a forested ridge or hill or the site of an old forest fire. In the dialects of southern Lapland, however, "rova" means a heap of stones, a rock or group of rocks in a stretch of rapids, or even a sauna stove.



Transportation in Rovaniemi

It is easiest to walk in Rovaniemi city centre but if you would like to go somewhere more far, for example *Santa Claus Village or SantaPark*, hop in to local bus! The bus stops in the centre are located in **Ruokasenkatu**. From there you can get to all directions and parts of Rovaniemi.



By Bus:

Timetables for local public transport are available at the bus station, from the general service desk at **OSVIITTA** and from local buses themselves. <u>Be also aware in case of less departures on weekends</u>. You can get a route map from the general service desk at Osviitta. Most of the busses depart every hour, during rushhours (during morning and late afternoon) every 30 minutes.

Here is a short listing of interesting and useful destinations with related bus line numbers:

Line 8: Takes you to the ARCTIC CIRCLE (Napapiiri) and SANTAPARK

Lines 2, 4, 10 or 14: Take you to the LAPLAND UNIVERSITY (Lapin yliopisto) and UNIVERSITY OF APPLIED SCIENCIES

(Rovaniemen ammattikorkeakoulu)

Line 8: Takes you to the RAILWAY STATION (Rautatieasema)

Lines 3, 5, 6 or 12: Take you to the CENTRAL HOSPITAL (Lapin keskussairala, LKS)

Line 1A: Takes you to the OUNASVAARA DOWN HILL CENTER (Hiihtokeskus)

Lines 1A, 3, 5, 6 and 9: Take you to the OUNASVAARA side of town



ARKTIKUM

Arktikum is a science centre and a museum. The exhibition of the Arktikum leads you through Arctic areas' and Finnish Lapland's history and modern day. You can see the Northern Lights multivision show almost every day in the Polarium Theatre. Arktikum also arranges several temporary exhibitions and events related to Northern themes.

Arktikum Cafe & Restaurant serves delicious menus and selfbaked cakes.



The Arctic in Change is set up in very friendly, interactive and aesthetic environment based on the human and seasonal cycles in the Arctic. The exhibition is dealing with the current changes in the Arctic.

Chronicles from the Finnish Lapland.

Northern Ways is an exhibition about stages in man and nature in the North. Find out about the life of the moose and bear in the wild, take a glimpse at city birds and pearl catching. The exhibition also features Sami culture, with its costumes and languages, and small-scale models of Rovaniemi from 1939 and 1944

Entrance fee:

Adults: 12 €, Children (7-15 yrs.): 5 €., Seniors and Students 8 €.

Family Ticket (2 adults + 2 children): 27 €.

Group Ticket (min 15 pax): 9,50 €/adult (reservation required).

Joint ticket to exhibitions in Arktikum and Korundi:

Adults: 15 €, Children (7-15 yrs.): 6 €, Seniors and Students: 10 €. Family Ticket (2 adults + 2 children 7-15 yrs. + children under 7 yrs.): 33 €

Joint ticket to Arktikum-Korundi-Pilke:

Adults 20 €, Children (7-15 yrs.): 10 €


SANTA CLAUS VILLAGE

You can meet Santa Claus and cross the magical Arctic Circle every day at the Santa Claus Village in Lapland!

There are many souvenir shops as well as **Santa's Main Post Office**, programme service companies and cafes and restaurants in the Santa Claus Village. And of course, Santa is there too, in his chamber every day of the year.

Information, guide service and Arctic Circle Crossing Certificates are available from the Arctic Circle Information Office.

Santa Claus Village is situated 8 km to the north of Rovaniemi direction Ivalo along highway number 4.

Santa's Express (No. 8). It statrs from the Railway Station and stops in Rovaniemi main spots. The trip to Santa Claus takes 15 / 20 minutes and be sure to warn the driver where you want to stop so he can let you at the main door of the Park or the Village.

Each trip costs $3,60 \in$ and you can buy the return trip at the beggining for $6,60 \in$. (Childrens pay only $1,80 \in$).

You can also ask for a Taxi at your hotel main desk. This is a very personal way to get to the parks, a bit faster but more expensive. A single way ride from Rovaniemi city center to Santa Village can cost you 20€.
